

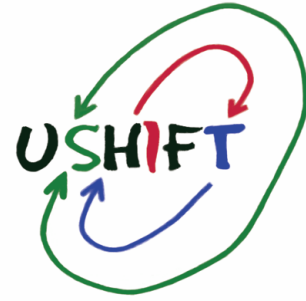

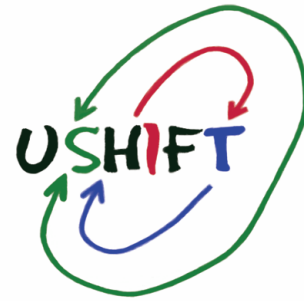

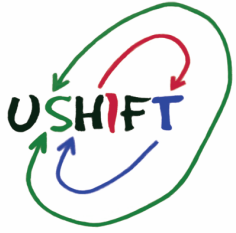
Rights & Democracy will cover the expenses (travel, food, accommodation) related to the event for selected students from within Ontario.

2. “What ethical practices does the company that produces your university’s merchandise (sweatshirts, mugs, etc.) abide by?”
3. What is your university’s buying policy? What emphasis is placed on the ethical background of the companies supplying the university?
4. What are the investment funds and actions owned by your university?
5. Are the banks in your area offering ethical funds?
6. Can you name one example in your community of an ethical partnership between the private sector and the NGO sector?
7. How are you consuming responsibly? Give examples of weekly decisions you could make and actions you could take to consume differently in your community? Name at least one example of an "ethical" business in your community and identify what makes it ethical.

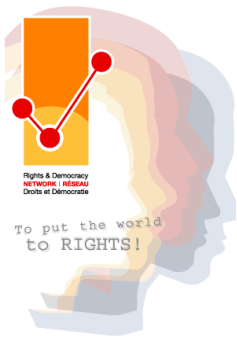

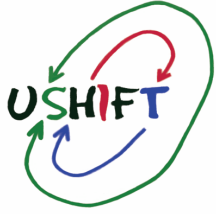
